Resolved, That the non-attending members be requested also to wear crape for 30 days.

DIED:-On board the frigate Macedonian, at Valparaiso, in March last, Lieut. John P. Cambreleng, of the U. S. Navy. By the death of this promising young officer, our Navy has lost a gallant spirit, and his companions in arms a sincere and generous friend.
