WILLIAM BETTS

Born in Bechsgrove, St. Croix, West Indies, January 28, 1802; died in Jamaica, Long Island, July 5, 1884, was graduated from Columbia College in 1820, and studied law with David B. Ogden and afterward with his father-in-law, Beverley Robinson. He was a trustee of Columbia College and of the College of Physicians and Surgeons; was a professor of law in Columbia (1845-54), and served some of the old and large corporations of New York as their counsel.
