Son of David and Annie (Chandler) Beach, was born at Tinmouth, Vt., Sept. 6, 1796

Fitted for college with Rev. Joel T. Benedict, of Chatham, N. Y., Charles Dillingham, of Richmond, Mass., and E. C. Benedict, of Williams College;

Williams College, 1820-21; Amherst College, 182-24 Studied theology with Rev. George E. Pierce, of

Harwinton, Ct.; Auburn Theological Seminary, 1824-27;

labored as an itinerant missionary in Susquehanna Co., Pa., eight months; in Bethany, Pa., four months; as a revival preacher in Ohio and New York, three months; oradined by the Presbytery of Troy, at Stephentown, N. Y., June 11, 1828, and preached there 1828-35; pastor Groton, N. Y., 1835-40; without charge Johnstown and Granville, Ohio, 1840-43; Homer, Ohio, 1843-51; without charge, Johnstown and Granville, Ohio, k851-78; from this time until his death, resided with his children at Champaign, Ill.

He was an ardent worker in the temperance cause, lectured frequently, and delivered the address before the first Temperance Society in New York State, at its first annual meeting, Dec. 25, 1827. Prof. Tyler imputes to Mr. Beach his conversion and his

Bornin Tinmouth, Vt., Sent. 6, 1796; united with the Church in New Lebanon, N. Y., July 2, 1818; graduated from Amherst College in 1824: entered Auburn near the close of Junior year; married to Liss Rhoda C. Churchill, of New Lebanon, N. Y., Aug. 11, 1829; died at Champaign, Ill., May 23, 1881. He had 4 sons and 3 daughters, all of whom, with his wife, survived him.

Ordained and installed at Stephentown, N. Y., by Presby. of Troy, June 11, 1828; Stephentown to 1835; Groton, 1835-40; Homer, O., 1843-50; resident Johnstown, O., Beloit, Wis., Granville, O., and Champaign, Ill., from 1850.
