

CLASS OF 1816

LUCAS BRODHEAD

Born Ulster Co., N. Y. October 31, 1793.
Graduated Union College, Schenectady, N. Y., Class
of 1816.

Came to Kentucky in 1820 to look after landed
interests of his uncle, Hon. Lucas Elmendorf, a
lawyer, and a man of large affairs and a member of
the Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Congresses.

Lucas Brodhead settled at Frankfort and practiced
law there until his death, October 31, 1849.

His son, Lucas Brodhead died October 1, 1914 at
"Okalee" his country residence in Woodford Co., Ky.

you could perhaps obtain

more full information on this
subject.
