Dear Mr. Brown:

Your inquiry for information regarding Andrew McCellum, Union 1800, received. I regret that I am unable to give you any information of real value. Andrew McCellum was the son of Daniel McCellum, a settler in Cherry Valley in Revolutionary times. After the massacre he returned to Cherry Valley and was one of the Trustees of the re-organized Presbyterian Church in 1785. His son Andrew McCellum was a student at the Cherry Valley Academy under the Principalship of the Rev. Eliphalet Nett, afterwards Union's most famous President. He was attracted to Union by the influence of Dr. Nett, and soon after leaving College moved to Cazenovia.

Further than this I cannot go and I question whether you will be able to find anything further in Cherry Valley. It is looking backward a long time and all traces of the McCellum family disappeared from Cherry Valley many, many years ago.

At request of Rev. Charles Temple I have looked carefully for information about Andrew McCollom of class of 1800 Union College and find that he was surrogate of St. Lawrence County during years 1809-12 inclusive and that he was the record owner of several parcels of real estate in the towns of Lenox, Oswegatchie, Madrid and Arkabut. At about that time or between 1807 and 1810 but careful examination by the County Clerk fails to reveal any information to throw light on anything connected with his family history.
