The death of Mr. John D. Clute, which occurred yesterday removes another of the now limited line of successful old Knickerbocker merchants. Born in Schenectady 86 years ago, Mr. Clute came to this city when he had reached his 25th year. He entered into business, became prosperous, and for the past quarter of a century has occupied himself in taking care of the wealth which he accumulated in his younger days. Mr. Clute will be remembered by many of the now wealthy citizens of New York, with whom he was a colleague in business. Although of a genial disposition, he has of late lived a retired sort of life at his residence No. 44 Park Ave.
