

1824 JOHN P. BOICE

John P. Boice came to Lewistown from New England about the year 1835. In 1841 he was here associated in practice with John David. He was a good lawyer, but not particularly strong as an advocate. He was a prominent Whig politician. He eventually removed to Henry, Marshall county, where his death occurred. He served as probate justice two or three terms in Fulton county.
