Died: At his residence in Milton, March 22d, Samuel McCrea, in the 80th year of his age. The deceased was once a practicing lawyer of this county, but retired from practice many years ago. He has since been a practical, and was a highly esteemed citizen. Samuel McCrea, the father of the deceased, was a brother of the celebrated Jane McCrea, of Revolutionary memory. He was one of the early settlers of Ballston, and died whilst Supervisor of that town, in 1809.

Dear Charlie:

I do not know enough about my ancestral history to be able to give you very adequate information in response to J. R. Brown, Jr. 's request for information about Samuel McCrea, Class of 1805 of Union College. I am, however, able to state that he was my great grandfather. The father of this Samuel McCrea served in the Revolutionad war and the family were the earliest settlers of the town of Ballston, N. Y. This Samuel McCrea to whom you refer married Rachel Wing in 1819, and died in West Milton, N. Y., in 1863, being buried in the old cemetery there. His daughter, Mary A. McCrea, married James Brann, whose son, Samuel McCrea Brann (for whom I am named), still lives at Springfield, S. D. Samuel McCrea Brann was a student at Union College for at least two years, graduating at Princeton somewhere around 1885. I do not have a Union College catalogue at hand, so am not able to verify the exact dates when he was a student there.
