Dec. 5, 1842. - Death of John Warford. He was admitted to the bar in 1805, and subsequently became judge of the Common Pleas. He was Aide-de-Camp to Gen. Moores during the War of 1812-1814, and made one of that group of men who were wont to gather in good fellowship at the inn of Israel Green. The pillared house on Charlotte street (known once as the Gough House) was built by him. - Three Centuries in Champlain Valley p 402

John B., studied law with Hon. Anthony I. Blanchard, was admitted to the bar, and married May 5, 1803, Maria Grace, a half-sister of Judge Blanchard, and a daughter of Walter Grace and his wife Mary (Anderson) (Blanchard) Grace, and settled in the practice of his profession at Plattsburgh, New York.
