My grea-grandfather, whose name was also Jonathan Crane, and Dr. Nott, Pres. of Union, were interested in property in Queens County, Hunters Point. My great-grandfather's holdings later passed to Union College. Naturally I lived as a boy on the reminiscences connected with Union."
