EDWARD FULLER

Son of Jeremiah Fuller, on his father's side was a lineal descendant of Samuel Fuller, one of the Puritans who landed from the ship Mayflower at Plymouth Rock in 1620; and on the side of his mother, of one of the Holland families that founded Schenectady. His mother, Mary Kendall, was born in Yorkshire, England, and came to this country with her father and brother about the year 1787.

(He was a brother of William K., Class of 1810; George K., Class of 1818; Samuel, Class of 1815)

Edward, who also completed his medical studies in New York, became a partner of Samuel, (his brother) in 1824. In the course of their joint practice each acquired an excellent reputation for skill and integrity. Edward ceased to practice his profession about the year 1834.

EDWARD FULLER

Son of Jeremiah and Mary (Kendall) Fuller  
Born February 15, 1807

Was a liberally educated gentleman, and completing his medical studies in New York, settling at Chittenango, he became a partner of his brother, Samuel, in 1824, acquiring an excellent reputation for skill and close attention to business. He retired from the practice in 1834, and amid the comfort of an ample fortune, died January 22, 1877, aged about 70 years, universally respected.
