There were eighty-two men in the class, of whom sixty-two graduated, and of this number twenty-two were admitted to Phi Beta Kappa, and, singularly, one other, a non-graduate, who died the same year the class was graduated, was also made a member of this fraternity. Twenty-four of the class became ministers, eighteen lawyers, eight physicians, four teachers, and four farmers, or, planters, as they were then called. Among the more notable men in the class were Judge Amasa J. Parker of Albany, Thomas Farrington, N. Y. State Treasurer, Prof. Calhoun of Washington College (Ct.), Judge Francis N. Mann, Mayor of Troy, N. Y., and Rev. Dr. Henry Tappan, President of Michigan University.
