Y., to 1842; taught school in various places to 1843, when he became a student at the Union School, Schenectady, N. Y., to 1845; thence he went to Boston, Mass., and studied law with Horace E. Smith, Esq., for 3 years; was adm. to bar of Middlesex co., Mass., in Boston 1848; returned to Broadal-

bin to 1849; was adm. to the bar of the City and County of New York 1849, and since has been a well-known practicing attorney and counsellor at law of New York city; partner in different law firms and on his own account. In politics a Republican; elected 1861 a Member of the Board of Councilmen of N. Y. city, representing the Sixth District. — See *Manual of the Corporation of the City of N. Y. 1861*, by David Thomas Valentine. Has repeatedly been elected a delegate to the City, County, and State Republican Conventions, and on their committees. Represented the 11th Assembly District in the Utica State Convention Feb. 25, 1880, &c.; member of the N. Y. city Republican Central Committee and on its Naturalization Committee, Mar. 16, 1881. Res. in New York city to 1886, and since at High Point, N. C. (1897).
