RICHARD DAVIS

Rev. Richard Davis graduated from Union College in 1828, and from Auburn Theological Seminary in 1830, and in 1835 took charge of the church in Springfield. He remained there for five years and was much prospered in his ministry,--fifty-five having been added to the church and forty of them on examination. He afterwards preached at Bridgewater, Oneida county, where he died of consumption, June 13, 1842, at the early age of forty-one. His heart turned in the hour of his dissolution to the church he first loved and called his own, and he begged to be carried for burial to its grave yard. He was of strong and original mind, independent in the formation of his opinions and free in the expression of them. Passages in his sermons were often peculiar, and even odd, and he sometimes gave offence by his frankness and abruptness. But he was natural in this, and of unquestioned piety, and his preaching was impressive and effective.
