DAVID R. AUSTIN

was born in Bridgeport, Conn. He was graduated in 1827 and immediately engaged as an instructor in the Chittenango Polytechnic School, studying Theology at the same time. In 1829 he entered the Theological Seminary in New Haven. In 1830 he opened the Woodbridge school at South Hadley, Mass.; was licensed to preach and in 1833 was ordained pastor of the church in Ludlow, Mass. In 1836 he became principal of the Academy in Monson, Mass; in 1839 was installed pastor of the Congregational Church in Sturbridge, Mass.; in 1852 was installed over the Second Congregational Church in South Norwalk, Conn., and withdrew in 1866. He continued to reside there until his death, Nov. 8th, 1879, in his 80th year. After his dis mission from the pastorate he continued to engage in every good work. He left a son and a married daughter. He was a strong Republican.
