HORATIO FOOTE

Born Northfield, Mass., February 10, 1796  
Married February 15, 1826, Abigail Kirkland, of Bridgewater,  
New York. She died June 5, 1883.  
Died May 10, 1886 in Ellington, Ill.

He was educated at Hartwich (Hartwick ?) Academy, N. Y.  
Graduated at Union College, 1820, and Auburn Theological  
Seminary, 1824.

Ordained pastor of the Presbyterian Church, Kingston,  
Ontario, September, 1825, discharged 1828. In Montreal,  
Canada, and Champlain, N. Y., 1828-31. Evangelist in Burlington,  
Vermont, Hartford, Conn, Buffalo, N. Y., 1831-40. Pastor  
of First Congregational Church, 1840-47 in Quincy, Ills.,  
without change thereafter, except that he was Hospital  
Chaplain during the War.

Trustee of Knox College.

He died May 10, 1886 in Ellington, Ills.
