Historical Note

The Schenectady Wintersports Club was formed in 1932, with a formal constitution being adopted in 1934. Its first president was Dr. Vincent Schaefer. Other charter members included C.G. Suits, L.E. Clover, Clarence Gregg, and C.W. Woodall. The intention was to establish a family-oriented club to promote skiing and to establish a snow train from New York's Capital District to North Creek, the present site of Gore Mountain. The snow trains, which began running in 1934, were very successful and ran into the late thirties. Along with other outdoor locations, this offered the opportunity for many families to ski, snowshoe, and toboggan at affordable costs. In addition to arranging ski trips, the club hosted guest lecturers, demonstrations, ski schools, first aid trainings, proficiency tests and film screenings including the annual Warren Miller Movie. In 1962 the Club purchased a ski lodge approximately 13 miles south of Stowe, Vermont, which it has maintained and operated since. In 1976, the Northern New Your Paddlers was formed as a division of the Club to sponsor paddling events and watersports in the summer. In addition, the Mohawk Valley Hiking Club later joined to create an organization that promotes activities year-round. The club is currently a member of the New York Capital District Ski Council. It has been lauded as being instrumental in making New York one of the ski capitals of the eastern United States.

Content Description

Administrative records consist of meeting minutes, financial records, membership lists, agreements, constitutions, bylaws and lists of officers. General records include newsletters, printed materials, historical files, information on ski lodge construction, photographs and miscellaneous materials from the years 1929 to 2002.

Scope and Contents

The series contains copies of the Schenectady Wintersports Club newsletter, the Ski Chatter, and the Northern New York Paddlers newsletter, the Blade, information on the construction and maintenance of Stowe Lodge, letters documenting petitions for the 1932-1933 snow train, membership lists, advertisements, programming schedules, printed materials, historical files and general correspondence. Newspaper clippings and articles document individual club members and group outings. Photographs show work parties at Stowe and individual ski trips. Writings include a typescript of early club history written by Vincent Schaefer. One disc contains master word processing files for all newsletters.
