LORENZO FLETCHER HAMLIN

Son of Rev. Jabez and Esther (Stowe) Hamlin, named for the celebrated Rev. Lorenzo Dow, a companion of his father.

Born Hillsdale, now Austerlitz, N. Y., March 26, 1803; attended Hudson Academy; graduated from Union College, Schenectady, N. Y., ;823; taught school in Catskill and other places; studied law seven years; removed to Elyria, Ohio, about 1830, and opened a law office there with his brother Edward; after his brother retired the firm became Lockwood & Hamlin; retired from practice 1843, and took charge of his father's farm. It is said that he wrote the text for Hazen's Grammar, published by his brother-in-law; Methodist; unmarried.

He died of cancer, Elyria, August 16, 1858.
