ABIJAH GREENE, '34,

was born at Galway, Saratoga Co., N. Y., Dec. 19th, 1810. In College he was a member of the Adelphic Society. afterwards spent two years at Princeton Theological Seminary.

He entered the Presbyterian ministry and received later the title of D.D. He preached at Cold Spring, Putnam Co., N. Y., for several years; then at Highland Falls, Orange Co., N Y., for

seven years; then at Rensselaerville, Albany Co., for one year. He labored for the Colonization Society for one year and while thus employed he was called to Rockland Co., to be pastor of the churches at Ramapo and Rockland Lake. He preached there for five years. His last charge was Bleecker, Fulton Co., N. Y., where he preached for six years, collecting while there the money for the church that was being built on his arrival. He was very faithful in his ministry. For four years before his death his memory became feeble and he lost interest in all but religious things. His character was marked by devotion and guilelessness. He retired from the ministry nearly 20 years ago and went to live with his father-in-law, a wealthy property owner at Highland Falls. His political sentiments were Republican.

He was found dead in his bed at Harlem, N. Y., from the effects of gas which he omitted to turn off on retiring He leaves

a widow and four children.
