SAMUEL FREEMAN HEADLEY.

Born at Litchfield, N. Y., Jan. 20, 1808.

Died at Morristown, N. J., July 24, 1869.

Married Maria Josepha, daughter of Capt. John Boyd, Nov. 28, 1832. She was born in Northumberland, Co., Pa., Spet. 16, 1808; died at Morristown, N. J., in May.

Samuel Freeman Headley graduated from Union College, Schenectady, N. Y., with honors in 1831, after which he entered the law office of Robert C. Grier, later one of the Judges of the Supreme Court. Mr. Headley practiced for many years in the courts of Luzerne, Columbia, Northumberland and adjoining counties where his distinguished abilities soon placed him among the leaders of the Democratic party to which he adhered until the nomination of Buchanan. On the breaking out of the rebellion he identified himself with the cause of liberty and union.
