

Killed Sept. 9, 1850, in accident on the Western Railroad
(now Boston and Albany Rd.)

The deceased Col. Mumford was an elderly gentleman, who had survived three wives, each of whom left him a daughter, whose only worldly protector has now been snatched from them. The one present with him at the time of the accident was the offspring of his second wife, and is about 14 years old. Her injury was upon the head. Her agony at the loss of her father is indescribable; she continued wildly to call for him long after his lifeless body had been exhibited to her.
