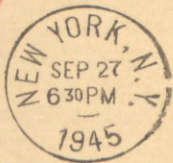

Theodore Frelinghuysen Romeyn was a graduate of Union College in the class of 1822. We have some biographical material but no picture. He was not a founder but might have been a relative of Dirck Romeyn, who was the most active among those who secured a charter for Union College in 1795. THEODORE FRELINGHUYSEN ROMEYN

DIED: At Wilksborough, North Carolina, where he went for the benefit of his health, in October, 1832, Theodore Frelinghuysen Romeyn, Attorney at Law, of Oswego, New-York, and the eldest son of the Rev. Thomas Romeyn, of Amsterdam, N. Y., in the 32nd year of his age, after an illness of about sixteen months, which he endured with great meekness, resignation to the Divine Will and christian patience; and has left evidences of a well grounded hope, that by the grace of God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, he was prepared to leave this world of trial, and enter with joy upon a blissful immortality. He has left a wife who accompanied him to the south, to mourn the death of a kind and affectionate husband, and his parents the loss of a son, endeared to them by the sweetness of his disposition and the warmth and devotion of filial affection and kindness. In his death the profession has lost one of the most promising sons, and his friends and acquaintances one endeared to them by the sincerity of his friendship, the kindness of his heart and the affability and frankness of his manners.
