

JAMES S. HORTON

was born in Hamptonburg, Orange county, N. Y., was graduated at Union in 1827, studied Medicine and practised in Florida, Orange County, N. Y., laboriously and successfully, and afterwards in Goshen, in the same county, where he remained till 1848. He then, in consequence of failing health, went to Muscatine, Iowa, and after three years' residence there settled on a farm near the city, giving up regular practice a number of years before his death but still attending to the wants of the poor. He was a strong Republican, a citizen of public spirit and an earnest friend of the Union during the late strife, giving to the Soldiers' Aid Society and other organizations his time and means and sending to the field three of his sons. He was a zealous member of the Presbyterian Church and one of its officers. His health and vigor were remarkable to the last week of his life; his fatal illness, pneumonia, having continued but a few days. He died March 23rd, 1879, at Muscatine, in the 74th year of his age, leaving a widow, two sons and one daughter.

JAMES S. HORTON

WAS BORN IN Hamptonburg, Orange County, N. Y., 1805. He was graduated in 1827. He became a farmer. His last residence was Muscatine, Iowa. He died March 24th, 1879.
