Second son of Col. James Robertson and Elizabeth (Rogers) daughter of Elihu Rogers, a descendant of John Rogers, the Christian martyr, was born November 15, 1806, (at Windham, N.Y.), and married, December, 1835, Elizabeth Hamlin.

He was a graduate of Union College, also of the Berkshire Medical College. He practiced his profession a number of years in North East, Dutchess County. He afterward became connected with the furnace and iron business, in which he was very successful.

He died in Canastota, September 27, 1883, aged 76. He left a wife and one child. The latter is wife of John Fowler, an attorney living in Syracuse.
