Y.; postmaster at Fulton 1840-1844; member of the State house of representatives in 1847 and 1848; served in the State senate in 1855; elected as a Republican to the Thirty-sixth Congress (March 4, 1859-March 3, 1861); resumed the practice of medicine in Fulton, N. Y.; died in Petersburg, Va., May 19, 1876; interment in Mount Adnah Cemetery, Fulton, N. Y.
