## 1827

Rev. Algernon S. McMaster D. D., died recently. He was the son of Rev. Dr. Gilbert McMaster, and brother and college classmate with Dr. E. D. McMaster, whose memory is cherished by loving friends in Hanover College and Miami University. After graduation, Dr. A. S. McMaster taught and studied theology five or six years, and in 1833 was ordained pastor of Galway church as successor to his father, which position he held until 1838.
