Charles Winne, born October 22, 1811, was the eldest  
son of Jellis Winne, Jr., and Sarah Fondoy, his wife,  
both of Albany, N. Y. He was educated at the Albany  
Academy, graduated from Union College, Schenectady,  
N. Y., and from the New York College for Physicians  
and Surgeons. After his graduation he settled in  
Buffalo, N. Y., and there, a wise and cultured physi-  
cian, practiced his profession till his death on May

CHARLES WINNE

A native of Albany, came to Buffalo in 1833, in which year he also joined the society (The Medical Society of the County of Erie). He was chosen a delegate to the State Society in 1834 and was health physician of Buffalo in 1836. He served as treasurer of the society during the years 1836, '37, and '38, was secretary in 1845-46, and was associated in practice for some years with Dr. Josiah Trowbridge and Dr. Walter Cary (Class of 1839). He became president of the society in 1863, and attained fame as a surgeon. He died in 1877.
