## JEREMIAH WOOD

In 1825 Rev. Jeremiah Wood, then a young man lately graduated at Princeton, was sent out as a missionary; when Mr. Ammerman gave up his pastorate; of the Low Dutch Reformed Church of Mayfield) Mr. Wood stepped in, and on September 27, 1826, the church was re-organized, assuming the name of "The Central Presbyterian Church of Mayfield" by which name it is still known. Mr. Wood was duly installed as pastor by authority of the Albany Presbytery.
