Born Georgetown, Mass, April 2, 1814.
Union College 1835.
Pastor, Middleton, Mass., May 8, 1845 to Dec.23,1846;
Henniker, N. H., Dec.1,1847 to March 20, 1850; New
Marlboro', Mass., Sept. 28, 1852 to Sept. 2, 1862.
a. p. Hopkinton, Conn., 1864-5; Thomaston, 1865-6.
Pastor, Liverpool, N. Y., 1866-8; Thetford, Vt.,
June 2, 1868 to Dec. 15, 1873; Windsor, March 4, 1874.
Resigned, 1878, on account of paralytic shock, but
never dismissed.
Married Dec.22, 1847, Emily A, Putnam, of Danvers.
Died in Danvers of apoplexy, June 30, 1880, aged 66
years, 2 months and 20 days.

Richard T., son of Dea. Stephen and Mary (Jewett) Searle, fitted for college at Phillips Academy, Andover Mass. graduated at Union College, Schenectady, N.Y. in 1835; Andover Theological Seminary in 1841; preached in several places until May 8 1845, when he was ordained over the church at Middleton Mass; in Henniker from Nov 20 1847 to Mar 20 1850; Marblehead in 1851; Marlboro, Mass 1852 to 1862; Harwinton Conn 1864 to 1865; Thomaston Conn 1865 to 1866; Liverpool N.Y. 1866 to 1868; Rhetford Vt 1868 to 1874; then in Windsor Vt where he died 1878.
