Son of John and Maria Elizabeth (Jordan) Wheeler.

Born at Murfreesboro, N. C., October 5, 1810

Died September 8, 1879.

Married in Bertie Co., N. C., March 14, 1836, Lucinda Pugh Bond, who was born at Quitsna, N. C., Nov. 20, 1814; died December 9, 1879, daughter of Lewis Bond and Catherine (Pugh) Bond.

M. D., University of Pennsylvania, 1833.

Colonel of Cavalry in the Confederate Army.

Postmaster at Murfreesboro, N. C.

1. Catherine Pugh, born Jan. 12, 1837; married Mar. 20, 1868, John Watson Cooper (two children)
2. Elizabeth Jordan, born Jan. 1, 1840; died Oct. 7, 1844.

Entered in the Class of 1829, from Murfreesboro', N. C. . . . A. M. (hon.) Columbian Univ. 1845; M. D. Columbian Univ., 1832.

Physician. Practiced in Murfreesboro', 1832-67, and near Windsor, N. C., 1867, until his death; served in Confederate States Army near the end of the Civil War.

Agent for Chowan Baptist Female Institute, Murfreesboro', and for a Female Seminary formerly in operation at Grenada, Miss.

Trustee Columbian Univ., 1861-62.

On July 14, 1858, was issued the first issue of the new Murfreesboro paper, "The Citizen," owned and edited by Dr. Samuel J. Wheeler, a Democrat, and a strong and spicy Democratic organ. In 1859 Wheeler sold "The Citizen" to Charles H. Foster (Bowdoin).
