EDWARD M. COE

Son of Jonas Coe (Rutgers 1789) and Eliza Huntting, was graduated at Union College in 1815. He studied law, and engaged in the practice of it at Troy, where he died February 12, 1828, aged thirty-one years.

He was a brother of John R. Coe, Union 1816.

NOTE A biography of Jonas Coe, father of Edward M. Coe, may be found in the Annals of the American Pulpit, by William B. Sprague Vol. 3.

EDWARD MORRIS COE.

Son of Rev. Jonas and Elizabeth Hunting Miller Coe. Born at Lansingburgh, N. Y., September 29, 1796. Was graduated at Union College, A. B., 1815 and was attorney-at-law at Troy, N. Y., where he died in early manhood, February 11, 1828.

He married Mary A. McCullen. Children born at Troy, N. Y.

I. Jonas Mynderse, born in 1823.

II. Edward Henry, born Oct.19, 1825; when a young man went to sea, and was one of the mariners of the ship New World who rescued the crew of the ship New Monarch burnt at sea Aug.24,1848, receiving from the Mass.

Humane Society a gold medal for heroism in this exploit. In the gold fever of 1849 he went to Sacramento, Cal., where he remained 4 years and then settled at San Francisco, Cal., where he resided the rest of his life, for many years was connected with the custom house, and died July 25, 1897. He married at Sacramento, Nov.23, 1854, Elizabeth Hudson Barney, born at Homer, Mich., Nov.12, 1837, daut. of Milton and Sophia (Dorsey) Barney; she resides (1909) at Los Angeles, Cal.
