PER LEE PINE

Born 269 Mill Street, Poughkeepsie, March 14, 1809. His preceptor was Dr. Delafield, of New York City, and he graduated from P. & S., 1834. After two years spent in study in London and Paris, he began the practice of medicine in Poughkeepsie, where he remained until death. An unfortunate circumstance occurring soon after his return from Europe cast a shadow over his professional, life. cousin of Dr. Pine's was on trial for murder and Dr. Pine testified that there was insanity in his family, and that he realized this in his own case. Dr. Pine was a modest, unassuming, Christian gentleman. He brought into the practice of his profession an intelligence, zeal, industry and perseverance worthy of the largest measure of success, which was denied him. His work was among the poor, giving them the best he had, never shirking the call of duty, or humanity. He was known among his associates for his integrity, ability and courtesy. Dr. Pine never owned a home, or drove from choice, but made visits six miles from home on foot.

He died of pneumonia, May 13, 1882, in the house in which he was born.

was born at Poughkeepsie, N. Y., March 14th, 1809. He left Corefore graduation. He studied medicine and surgery in New York city till
1834; spent a year in Paris, France, and then settled in Poughkeepsie,
where he was very successful in his practice. He was physician to several
public institutions; President of the Dutchess County Medical Society in
1881–82; member of the New York State Medical Society; Delegate to the
U. S. Medical Society; member of the Board of Education from 1846 to 1866;
honorary member of the Westchester Medical Society. He was a Democrat, and belonged to the body of Birthright Quakers. He was highly
esteemed as a man, as well as for his professional ability. He died at
Poughkeepsie, May 13th, 1882, of pneumonia. He did not marry.
