Thomas J. Ruger was born in Northumberland, Saratoga Co., New York, February 25, 1802, entering Union College, Schenectady, N. Y., at the age of twenty-two, he graduated, with high honors, taking the degree of M. A. In 1830, he became principal of the Wilbraham Academy, in Massachusetts. Two years afterwards he was appointed president of the Wesleyan Seminary at Lima, N. Y. Four years later he resigned. In 1836 he was ordained a priest of the Protestant Episcopal Churchand so on after became rector of Christ Church Parish, of Sherburne, N. Y. In 1839 he was called to the rectorship of St. John's Parish, Marcellus, N. Y. In 1844 he became rector of Trinity Church Parish, Janesville, Wis. He died in Janesville, Wis., April 21, 1878.

The Ruger family came in the 17th century from Holland to America and settled in Dutchess County, N. Y. His mother was Jane Jewell, from a puritan family of Connecticut, of English ancestry. His grandmother, Katherine LeRoy, was of a French

Hugenot family.

Thomas Jefferson Ruger who graduated from Union College in 1830 with the degree of Bachelor of Arts. The following material taken from the "Genealogy of the Morris Family" written by Mrs. Lucy Ann (Morris) Carhart and published by A. S. Barnes Company in New York 1911, is all that our records contain.

Manross. librarian of the Church Historical Society, Philadelphia, to whom I had written for information regarding Rev. Thomas Jefferson Ruger, who was graduated from Union College in 1837. He spent eight years in the ministry in New York State and was then the first rector of Trinity Church in Janesville, Wisconsin Territory, from 1844 to 1855 and died in Janesville in 1878. I am interested in finding out something of his ancestry, at least the names of his parents, which, Dr. Manross suggested, might be found in your alumni records. My great-grandfather, whose name was Johann Benjamin Ruger was a Lutheran minister, a pastor of a church in Ihleburg, Germany, where he died early in the 19th century, his son,, born in 1796, was my grandfather, and came to this country in 1846. I am trying to discover whether the Rev. Thomas Jefferson Ruger may have been my grandfather's cousin, or, in some way related to him.
