

WILLIAM T. SCOTT, '30,

was born in Brunswick county, Va., March 10th, 1809. In College he was a Sigma Phi. He left before graduation. He studied law; settled in Charlotte county, Va., and practiced for a few years, but followed the occupation of farmer in that county during the rest of his life. He was successful, a good neighbor and a type of the Virginia gentleman. He was a Member of the State Legislature during the session of 1867. His political sentiments were Old Line Whig. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church. He died December 21st, 1882, of paralysis, leaving a widow and son.

Born March 9, 1809, in Brunswick Co., Va.; Died Dec. 21, 1882, at Charlotte C. H., Va.

Entered in the Class of 1830, from Charlotte C. H., 1826, and completed Junior year.

Counsellor at Law and Planter. Taught school in Virginia some years; admitted to the Bar and practiced three years at Charlotte C. H.; retired, and cultivated his plantation in Charlotte Co. until his death.

He was an active Unionist through the Civil War; a leading member of the Virginia State Agric. Soc. . . . Member Va. General Assembly, 1866-67.
